
# Happenings in the Elementary


## 3rd Grade - Mrs. Hrbek






This year juniors will be taking the ACT College Entrance Test instead of the NeSA test from the state. (Eighth grade still will take the NeSA this spring).




# **One Chance Leadership Youth Motivational Speaker**


### Mrs. Nelson's Classes:

**Digital Media:** The class has been manipulating pictures using the GIMP program. This is a free download and is similar to Photoshop. Students are able to cut an image out of one picture and blend it with another picture to make it one image (the horse and sunset).

They learned to take an image and use filters from the GIMP program and create fire and flames on top of the image (water bucket now a bucket of flames).

Most recently the students created an image to make it look like it was flying apart in the wind (girl picture flying apart).

The class also used what they have learned and created a picture of a polar bear that looks like it is coming out of the highway.







**Info Tech I:** The class is discovering how to create interesting PowerPoint presentations by using transitions, animations, pictures, themes, fonts, and adding shapes to pictures to make a new image. Prior to these projects the students learned to use the Word program to create flyers, MLA style reports with footnotes, and application letters with tables.

7<sup>th</sup> **Computers:** The students have produced correctly formatted memos and letters, and are just starting to explore formatting reports with a works cited page and eventually they will generate big-ger reports that include a title page, table of contents, and works cited page.

**Elementary Keyboarding:** Kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade are learning to navigate the computer and become better users of the mouse as well as becoming good digital citizens. 3<sup>rd</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders are working on keyboarding skills.

Accounting I: The students can journalize transactions into a general journal and are now studying the techniques of posting these transactions into the general ledger.
