

# K-3 STEM

Culinary Skills classes sweetly celebrated Valentine's Day by creating special treats like chocolate globes and cups filled with chocolate mousse, chocolate covered strawberries, and cupcakes.









Food & Wellness class is learning about hydroponic and vertical farming. Through the Carl D. Perkins Grant the Family and Consumer Science program was awarded \$3000 which covered expenses for four grow towers for vertical farming and a 90-site, 10 tube hydroponic grow system. Hydroponic is a high-tech growing method, where vegetables are grown without soil and often times 90% less water. Vertical farming is the practice of growing produce in vertically stacked layers. The practice can use soil, hydroponic or aeroponic growing methods. Vertical farms attempt to produce food in challenging environments, like where arable land is rare or unavailable. As populations world wide increase, both methods will be widely used out of necessity.











Through the Carl D. Perkins Grant, the FCS program was also able to purchase 2 iPads for recording and recipe use while cooking as several of the culinary programs at colleges use iPads daily. A pregnant woman model and a human reproduction and development kit were also purchased with Perkins funding for the Human Growth and Development and Parenting classes offered through our FCS program.




